

Level 3 NVQ in Youth Work

This qualification has been designed for those working in Youth Work. To achieve the award candidates must complete four mandatory units which cover enable young people to explore and develop their values and self-respect; enable young people to work effectively in groups; enable young people to use their learning to enhance their future development; and manage your work and create effective work relationships. Candidates must also complete four units from two optional groups.

Group C, Optional Units – (2 units from this group)

Investigate needs and Provision for Young People and Promote Youth Work Opportunities
 Identify Relationships with Other Organisations and Individuals
 Build and Maintain Partnership Work
 Provide Information to Aid Policy Formation, and the Improvement of Practices and Provision
 Develop Teams and Individuals to Enhance the Quality of Youth Work
 Promote a Culture of Health and Safety

Assessment Methods Time Frame: 18 months

Direct Observation of candidate's performance by the assessor and the assessor's judgment on testimony from an Expert Witness Testimony are the main methods of assessment and primary sources of evidence. The majority of assessment for this qualification will take place in the work place under real work conditions, using observations by a qualified assessor and/or testimony from an expert witness, work products etc.
